HOW TO KEEP A CONSERVATORY COOL IN THE SUMMER AND WARM IN THE WINTER

Some factors must be taken into account in order to maintain the ideal temperature for relaxing throughout the year, which largely depends on the construction method and materials used, as well as on the way they affect the structure's thermal efficiency.

Here are some of the materials that play an essential role in controlling a conservatory's heating and thermal insulation options:

- **Type of glass**

First of all, it's worth pointing out that not all glass is created in the same way. Some types of glass, such as the glass DFN uses, are designed to improve living comfort. Depending on where the structure is installed and its purpose in the home, DFN assesses the project by inserting insulating, low emissivity, solar control or selective glass panels. Glass panels make use of the best technology because they retain heat in winter and reflect heat coming from external solar radiation in summer.

- **Type of frame**

DFN's structures use iron thermal break windows. With the iron thermal break window system, we make the most of the legacy of tradition in its most authentic form, creating the same shapes, proportions and overlapping effects used in traditional 19th century hot-rolled steel profiles, while using advanced modern technology. Innovative high-density polyurethane makes it possible to fully comply with current building energy containment legislation and contemporary living needs, even when a higher level of insulation is required compared to classic iron windows. DFN offers a wide range of accessories and finishes for every type of window.

- **Type of roof**

The roof also affects the architecture's ability to retain heat. There may be different roof designs, but DFN recommends using glass as, with the aforementioned precautions, it guarantees thermal insulation accompanied by excellent natural sunlight, creating a light and airy space.

- **Type of edge beam**

Sufficient insulation is also provided by the conservatory's edge beams. DFN can study and create edge beams that will insulate the structure from the ground up.

- **Heating and air conditioning systems**

Either in view or hidden, air conditioning and heating systems help to keep the temperature inside the room constant, in addition to the insulating materials listed above.
